Electronic High School is an open enrollment system over the internet that offers a large variety of courses. Classes are offered FREE to all Utah high school students (grades 9-12).

Classes are sponsored by the Utah State Office of Education (USOE) and are fully accredited with all Utah school districts. Students need to be motivated enough to work on their own with minimum supervision.

East Shore High School Online is an accredited high school in Alpine School District. Most required and many elective classes are offered at ESH. There is a yearly cost to register, plus cost per semester credit. A packet takes approximately 10 to 15 hours to complete. Two packets equal .25 credit.

Public Education Online

Students are eligible to participate in Public Education Online if they are in grades 9-12 and enrolled in a Utah public school. A student may enroll in up to two credits in online courses ([except for early graduation](#)). The student may earn no more credits in a semester than the number of credits they may earn by taking a full course load during the regular school day at their high school classroom. Please visit
