As the administration of Oak Canyon Junior High School, We are proud to work in a wonderful community. We are very impressed with the involvement of parents, teachers and students in the collaboration process. We are committed to all students and their success. There are many opportunities for all students to get involved. We encourage all students to find their interests and get involved in school.

We are involved in an ongoing process at Oak Canyon where our teachers work collaboratively each Monday to identify students who are struggling with various concepts, and those who are excelling in their studies. They also examine areas where they can improve their own teaching skills and instruction. We also participate in E-Time every Tuesday through Friday. Students have a 25 minute block of time which is based on the student's needs. When students are struggling in one or more of their classes, they have the opportunity to go to those classes and work one on one with their teacher's to gain a better understanding in those subject areas. When the students are passing all of their classes, they have the opportunity to participate in other educational activities. The collaborative model and E-Time activities have been extremely valuable in improving student learning.

We have recently received our data from the spring SAGE testing. As a school we received a B grade. This is a great score as we were only 1% away from receiving an A. Oak Canyon continues to be a great school. This is the first year this scoring method has been used. This is new and exciting! As the state and schools move forward, our understanding of the data will improve, and we will continue to grow. We are excited about where we are as a school and are very proud of the faculty, staff, students and parents who are involved in this great community.





Below is the decreased amount of failing grades since implementing E-Time.










Oak Canyon Sage testing Results

These Standards include rigorous expectations for post high school readiness that meet nationally and internationally competitive standards.







Fast Facts:

- All 9th grade students had the opportunity in October to take the ACT Explore Test. This test provides information for planning high school courses and prepares students for the ACT.
- Over 50 students are involved in serving the school and community through PTSA Student Leadership.
- Seven students from Oak Canyon attended the National Technology Student Association (TSA) conference in Washington D.C. last June. They participated with 5,000 other students in 4 of the 32 contests. Two of our students took fourth place! We also had three 7th place winners.
- For the past 18 years Oak Canyon Jr. High School has had an award winning Science Demo Team wowing audiences across the state of Utah with spectacular science experiments and demonstrations. This same team has taught and performed for over 60,000 Utah students as well.
 Mr. Panee and Mr. Hodges are the team advisors and each year train, motivate, and have an enjoyable time with 50 plus ninth graders who conduct 45 different and compelling experiments.
 We are not a magic show but a science assembly that magically excites students about the world around us.
