



Below is the decreased amount of failing grades since implementing E-Time.




## Oak Canyon SAGE Testing Results


### ELA Proficiency

## Fast Facts:

- All 9th grade students had the opportunity in October to take the ACT Explore Test. This test provides information for students as they prepare for the ACT.
- Over 50 students are involved in serving the school and community through PTSA Student Leadership.
- Oak Canyon students: Jacob Johnson, Kolby Vernon, TJ Luebke, Jay Cliff, and Jackson Storrer attended the National Technology Students Associations 2015 convention in Dallas, Texas on June 27-July 2, 2015. They enjoyed participating in 7 different competitions and came home with a First Place trophy in the Systems Control Technology contest. They also competed in Dragster Design, Tech Bowl, Go Green Manufacturing, Junior Solar Sprint, Leadership Strategies, and Problem Solving. Technology Student Association is one of the Career and Technical Student Organizations that is promoted in the Alpine CTE Department. These Oak Canyon students are so appreciative of the support that they receive from Doug Golding, Glen Bailey and the district administration and school board. Terry Hunter is the mentor of the OCJH TSA.
- The Oak Canyon Science Team is in their 20th year of teaching science to students throughout the state. Over the years the demo team has acquired many awards and grants. Just to name a few, we received the Utah Jazz/ Phillip 66 Excellence in Science Teaching Award (\$5000), Micron Science Teaching Award (\$3000), and the Intel Innovations in Science Teaching Award (\$40,000), just to name a few. The Oak Canyon Science team has reached out to over 60,000 students throughout this great state of Utah. The science demo team is the longest running academic program in the school and has engrained itself into the rich academic culture of Oak Canyon Jr. High.

The School Community Council (SCC) oversees the Trust Land money received from the legislature each year. Guidelines for the expenditure of this money are used to "focus on the most critical academic needs to directly impact instruction and enhance academic excellence." 2014-15 trust land money has been spent in the following ways:

### Hourly/Certified Help

**Double Dose Math** .....\$19,050  
For 9th grade students who need extra help with math; there are two sections being taught.

**Math Lab**.....\$2,937  
After school math help provided to all students needing assistance from one of our certified math teachers.

**Math Aides**.....\$7,170  
Math help is provided to all students needing assistance.

**Guided Studies**.....\$13,715  
These classes are structured to provide students with individual guidance and support needed for success in school.

**Read 180**.....\$13,993  
This class provides direct instruction in reading comprehension, vocabulary building, and reading strategies to students needing additional support, based on data from CRTs and Lexile scores.

**English Aide**.....\$5,070  
English help is provided to all students needing assistance.

**Equipment (MyAccess Software)**.....\$8,055  
This program was provided for all students at Oak Canyon Junior High to improve writing.
