Commitment to your team:

Thank you for choosing to participate in Battle of the Books! Participation is completely voluntary, but once you make the commitment, we expect that you will take it seriously, have good sportsmanship, make friends, and have a great time! It will be important to have teams finalized so all the books can be read, and practice battles can start.

Meetings:

Meetings will most often be held during Cavetime on Mondays. Therefore, it is important to keep your grades up so that you are available during Caavetime to come to meetings. We may need to meet after school, more information on that will come in January.

Reading:

I require that each student read a minimum of 5 books from the reading list. When they have done this, they will qualify for a **free** Battle of the Books T-shirt! If your team has fewer than 5 members, it will be necessary to read more books so that each book has been read by at least one team member. Please take this responsibility seriously because this is a <u>TEAM</u> effort. Help out your team by doing your part, and you will be successful! I have all of the physical books in our library and either ebooks, audiobooks, or both on our school Sora account.

Reading + Practice Quizzes = Pins

Once you have read a book, fill out a Google Form to receive a pin to put on your lanyard for that book. The practice questions from the form will help us immensely as we start practice battles. Special awards will be given to participants who read all 20 books.

Canvas Course:

Practice quizzes, book summaries, and announcements will be available on the AFJH Battle of the Books Canvas course. You will be invited to the course later on.

Official Battles:

Official Battles will be held during Cavetime starting in March.
