VISTA HEIGHTS PACE SCORES

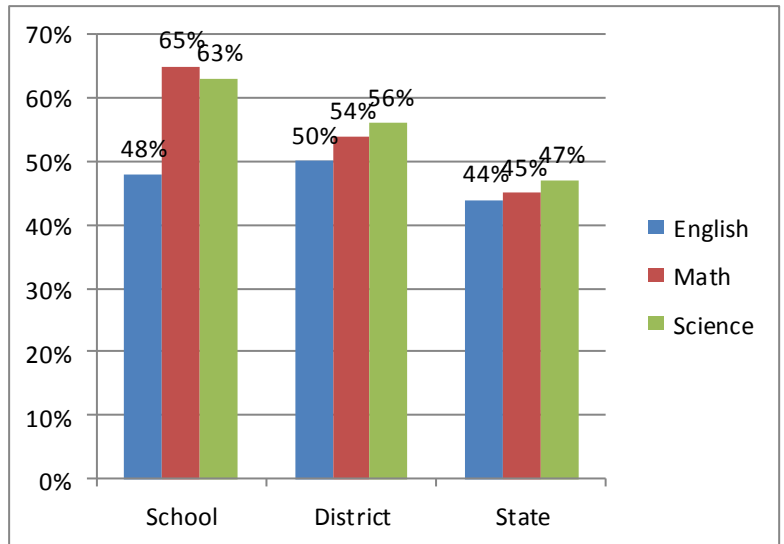
The “PACE” acronym represents the Governor’s initiative to achieve 66% benchmark by 2020. PACE stands for Prepare young learners, Access for all students, Complete certificates and degrees, and Economic alignment. This is the system used to illustrate how schools are performing on state tests. The scores are based on SAGE student performance and growth, which is year-end assessments given to all students during 4th term in math, science, and English.

Achievement Points: 176/300

(State Average: 142)

Growth Points: 227/300

(State Average: 190)



4H After-School

At the start of this school year, Vista Heights was given grant through 4-H to provide after school clubs for students. These clubs give students a chance to participate in a safe and educationally enriching environment. Each student is given 45 minutes directly after school to work on homework while provided a healthy snack. Students may use this time to work by themselves, with their peers, or a teacher.

Students are then provided 75 minutes of various enriching clubs each day after school. This Grant funding is for 3 school years with a minimum of 3 10-week sessions each year. Club leaders can be teachers, students, and/or community members.

Clubs have included archery, film-making, cross-country, and robotics. Later this year our school will be piloting a club called, “How to Survive a Zombie Apocalypse/Emergency Preparedness.”

TEAL Time Information

Last year we looked at revisions and improvements for our TEAL Time program. We had been utilizing daily planners for each of our students to help them track homework and assignments. Certain aspects of this program were beneficial, but overall student planners were not as beneficial for remediation. We went back to a grade-slip based structure with an additional option for teachers to request specific students to remediate with during TEAL.

This structure also allowed us to add in activities and extension activities such as Piñata making, sports tournaments, and food labs. Students are also able to earn community service hours as tutors in classes, and organizations are able to hold group meetings during this time.

During our first term of TEAL Time we encountered a more productive remediation for not only failing students but also those that would like to raise their mid-level grades. We are continuing to improve our TEAL Time program to benefit all students in meaningful ways.
