Topics That Will be Covered Include:

From “No Where to Know Where: The IEP and Transition Plan

The transition to adult life can leave you feeling you are “NO Where” – totally lost! Get to “KNOW Where” by learning about planning for transition to adulthood. UPC will go into detail about the process the IEP team follows to help students have a successful transition.

Self-Determination: Whose Decision Is It Anyway?

Self-Advocacy and self-determination are important skills that students with disabilities need to develop. This workshop will help parents and educators teach self-advocacy skills to students with disabilities.

State Services Presentation and Agency Fair

What services are available? Representatives will be present to discuss: Accessibility services at UVU, Division of Services for People with Disabilities, Guardianship Associates of Utah, Utah Work Incentive Planning Services and Vocational Rehabilitation.
