COMMUNITY COUNCIL & TRUSTLANDS FUNDING

The School Community Council continues to meet on the second Wednesday of the month throughout the school year to discuss Canyon View's most critical academic needs. Elections for the School Community Council will be held during the last meeting on April 9, 2019. The responsibility of the School Community Council (SCC) is to develop a School Improvement Plan and a School Trust Land Plan (graphed below). The Trust Land funds are used to meet the school's most important academic needs: struggling readers, underachieving students, struggling Latino population, and 9th grade students who are deficient in graduation credit.

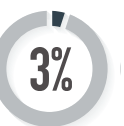

STATE WIDE ASSESSMENTS

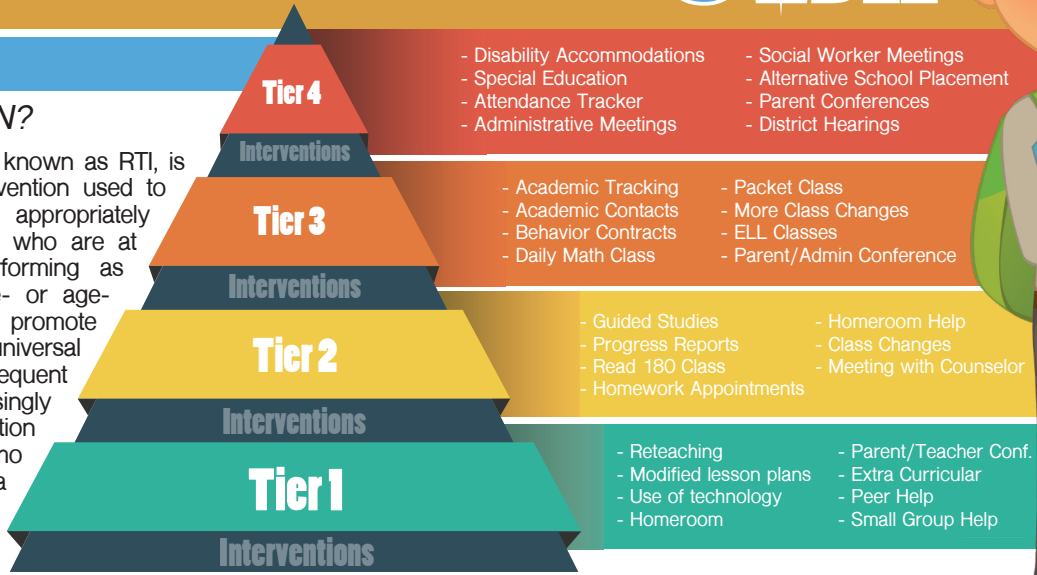
In the spring of 2018, students took one or more SAGE assessments measuring their knowledge and skills of the Utah Core Standards. These standards reflect the knowledge and skills students need to succeed in careers and in college. This year's reporting system has changed, there is no longer a school grade. There is however a gauge showing how well CVJH is performing. When it came to achievement and growth of students in core classes CVJH was in the typical range. This means that we were very typical to other schools with the same demographics. A highlight last year was the success we had with English Language Learners. We received an exemplary rating for the progress this group made. We also scored well in Math this year receiving a higher performance score than the year previous. INTERVENTIONS AT CVJH



What is an INTERVENTION?

A response to intervention, also known as RTI, is an approach to academic intervention used to provide early, systematic, and appropriately intensive assistance to students who are at risk for or already under-performing as compared to appropriate grade- or age-level standards. RTI seeks to promote academic success through universal screening, early intervention, frequent progress monitoring, and increasingly intensive research-based instruction or interventions for children who continue to have difficulty. RTI is a multileveled approach for aiding students that is adjusted and modified as needed.



PTSA is a way for parents, teachers, and students to work together for educational success. Some activities include; Family Fun Run, Summer Reading Program, helping with hearing testing, vision screenings, parent teacher conference, CARES Counsel, Red Ribbon Week, Spirit Week, Award dinners, Reflections just to name a few. Make sure you get involved and become a member of the Canyon View Junior PTSA. By participating you can BE more involved in your school community and more importantly your students community.



LEADING THE WAY THROUGH INNOVATION

Character Education

Canyon View will continue a character education program entitled "Project Wisdom". It addresses such issues as bullying, honesty, responsibility, etc.

Individual teachers will reinforce positive solutions through lesson plans available with the program.

CVJH Homeroom

In order to provide students every opportunity to be successful CVJH has initiated a structured homeroom remediation program. Tuesday—Friday students remediate during homeroom for 25 minutes. This remediation program gives all students access and opportunity to augment what they are learning in the classroom and improve their academic performance. Putting remediation time back into the classroom gives teachers the time they need to ensure content is delivered in a targeted manner and gives students the opportunity to work with every one of their teachers. We hope that this new approach to remediation will have a dramatic and immediate affect on individual student achievement.

Junior Latinos In Action

Latinos in Action is to empower youth to be college and career ready through culture, service, leadership and excellence in education. Most importantly, Latinos in Action is an avenue that allows students to develop and further their bilingual talents. Latinos in Action is a leadership opportunity for students to work together by seeking state and district partnerships in an effort to support and improve their academic performance and their college readiness. They engage in service leadership activities, including: serving their younger peers as role models at Orchard Elementary, mentoring and tutoring.

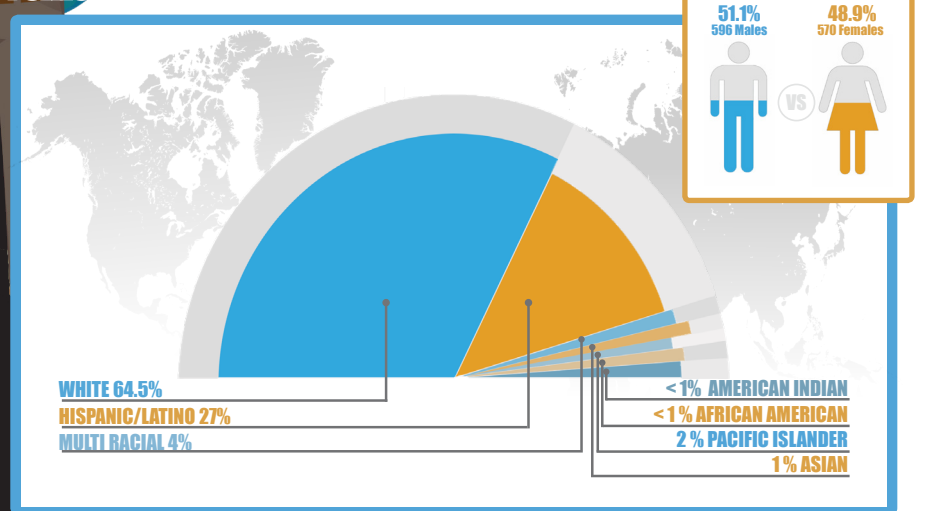
- 1 What do we expect students to learn?

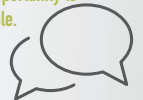

- FCCLA chapter officers attended the Fall FCCLA Leadership Conference with other student leaders from around the state of Utah. Officers participated in specific training for their chapter positions and collaborated with student officers from many other schools.
- Canyon View Junior High Symphonic Band, Wind Symphony and Jazz Band competed in the Parks Regional Music Festival, which includes middle school, junior high and high school bands from Utah, Idaho, Wyoming and Nevada. Our school received The Best Overall Jazz Band Award for the 22nd consecutive year, and was the 3rd highest scoring instrumental ensemble at the festival. Canyon View was the only school to achieve a Superior ratings.

STUDENTS

- Each month, Canyon View recognizes 5-6 students as Student of the Month. This honor is reserved for students who consistently demonstrate good character and work habits, or who have made a significant improvement.

SKILLS



- Approximately, 40 9th grade Foods 1 students earn a Food Handler's Permit in class each semester. The certification is good for three years and will help students qualify for future jobs. Already, several students have been hired in different jobs.
