
<u>Useful Tips for Parents and Students:</u>

*All 7th graders are required to take 1.0 unit of Career & College Awareness, .5 unit of PE, and .5 unit of Health. 8th graders are required to take .5 unit of PE. Students who have an IEP must meet requirements set by an IEP team for a completion certificate. Additional core classes above 7.5 credits count towards elective credit. Students with a D- grade or higher get credit.






