Dear Canyon View Community,

Happy New Year from all of us at Canyon View! We hope everyone enjoyed a relaxing and rejuvenating break from school. With the start of a new calendar year, it's a good time to get a fresh start and new perspective on school. We hope our students are focused and ready to thrive in 2022.

This year our staff has been working to improve our student literacy. Every teacher is looking for ways to incorporate reading, writing, speaking, and listening into their curriculum. We believe that a student with high literacy skills will be more successful in all of their classes and endeavors outside of school. Improved literacy benefits high achieving students, low achieving students, English Language Learners, and students with disabilities. For this reason, we believe literacy is one of the highest leverage activities we can focus on. Some things you might see in a literacy-focused classroom include an emphasis on vocabulary not for the sake of memorizing words but to help students understand complex ideas; various, brief writing activities to organize thoughts prior to class discussions; reading passages of text then discussing its meaning as a class. These kinds of activities traditionally have occurred in English class but we are starting to see more of them in science, math, CTE, arts, and PE classes too.

We appreciate all the effort our teachers have put into helping each student increase their literacy skills.



Are you interested in knowing how to help your students thrive and decrease the likelihood of them engaging in high risk behaviors? The Developmental Assets® are 40 research-based, positive experiences and qualities that influence young people's development, helping them become caring, responsible and productive adults. These assets are protective factors that have been consistently shown, by research of more than 5 million young people, that the more assets they have the more likely they are to thrive and the less likely they are to engage in a wide range of risky behaviors. Check out the actual research data. Research shows that the youth with the most assets are *more* likely to:

• Do well in school.

- Maintain good health
- Help others
- Overcome adversity

Research also shows that youth with the most assets are *least* likely to have problems with:

- Alcohol use
- Violence
- Illicit drug use
- Sexual activity

There are two categories of assets: external assets and internal assets. External assets are the assets that center around positive experiences from the people and experiences in a young person's life. Internal assets are those that focus on individual qualities that guide positive choices and develop a sense of confidence, passion, and purpose. This is a full list of the <u>40 assets</u>. Your student's school counselor is happy to work with you to help your student develop these assets.



HOW SICK IS TOO SICK FOR SCHOOL?

Cold and flu season is here. See our tips for parents and caregivers:

KEEP ME HOME:

Fever (higher than 100 degrees)

Sore Throat

Persistent Cough

Strep Throat

Vomiting or Diarrhea

Abdominal Pain (severe or long-lasting)

Illness (prevents from participating comfortably in activities)



SEND ME TO SCHOOL:

No Fever (without fever-reducing medicine for 48 hours)

> Occasional Cough (but no other symptoms)

Strep Throat (after 24 hours of treatment)

No Vomiting or Diarrhea (for 48 hours)
