Cost: Free to all Utah high school students until 2012-13 school year.

Cost: Average cost per .5 credits is \$128.00 plus books if needed.

Grades: 9-12

Cost: There is a yearly cost to register, plus cost per semester credit. \$75.00 minimum initial payment.

East Shore High School is Alpine School District's alternative High School program. Most required classes are offered at ESH plus many electives. It takes approximately 10-15 hours per packet and two packets equal .25 credits. Students must attend ESH for part of the work. There is a time limit on each packet. See your school counselor to register before you go to ESH!

Grades 9-11

Cost: \$25.00 non-refundable per credit
