ELECTRONIC HIGH SCHOOL

Electronic High School is an open enrollment system over the internet that offers a large variety of courses. Classes are offered FREE to all Utah high school students (grades 9-12).

Classes are sponsored by the Utah State Office of Education (USOE) and are fully accredited with all Utah school districts. Students need to be motivated enough to work on their own with minimum supervision.

East Shore High is Alpine School District's alternative high school program. Most required and many elective classes are offered at ESH. There is a yearly cost to register, plus cost per semester credit. It takes approximately 10 to 15 hours per packet. Two packets equal .25 credit. Students must attend ESH for part of the work. There is a time limit on each packet.

Average cost per .5 credit is \$124
High School credits will transfer for most work done in grades 9-12.
