

# EARN COLLEGE CREDIT WHILE IN HIGH SCHOOL

*Who would want to get college credits while still in high school?*

- Students who want to save time and money getting a college degree.
- Students who are working towards the New Century Scholarship.
- Students who are seeking an advanced degree and want a head start.

## Concurrent Enrollment

Concurrent Enrollment is a program where students enrolled in certain high school courses may be concurrently enrolled in a “companion” course at a local college or university. This means the student may receive college credit for taking high school classes.

Cost is minimal.

## Advanced Placement (AP)

Advanced Placement classes are college level classes taught in the high school. Students receive regular high school credit for taking the class and can opt to pay a fee (around \$94) to take a test in the spring. If passed, the student receives college credits.

## MTECH

Mountainland Technology College in partnership with Utah County school districts provides high school students with state-of-the-art advanced training programs during school hours for high school and college credits.

Cost is minimal.

## Distance Learning and EdNet

Utah Valley University offers interactive television classes at the high school. College credit is available for these classes. EdNet is Utah Educational Network’s interactive system that electronically brings college classes into other sites.

## On Campus Classes

Students can sign up for general education classes at UVU or other college campuses. Students can attend part or fulltime. 3 college credits are equivalent to 1 high school credit.
