





This year we have celebrated the 25th anniversary of the opening of Oak Canyon Junior High. We have had a long tradition of excellence. Our outstanding faculty and involved community of parents are committed to high levels of learning for all students.

But the kind of learning required to have a meaningful life has changed considerably since 1993, when Oak Canyon first opened its doors. Using the Alpine School District Vision for Learning as a starting point, we have spent the past eighteen months in dialogue about what we want for our students, and what kind of school we hope to become. While the district vision for learning describes what “learning” should mean in K-12 schools, we wanted to articulate more specifically our hopes for our particular students, in our unique Oak Canyon community, at this critical stage of life and learning. We sought the input of faculty, staff, administration, students, and parents. We considered the social/emotional environment we want for our school, the kinds of learners we will help our students become at this crucial juncture in their education, and the knowledge and skills most necessary for every student to develop.

Here are a few examples of parent responses about what they want for their students: *“I want my children to make connections with peers and teachers that help them feel confident in who they are and what they have to offer. I want them to be proud of their time during Junior High.”* *“My child struggles with academics. I hope he will get the basic education he needs to be ready for high school. Beyond that, I want him to enjoy his elective classes and feel a desire to pursue a career in one of those subjects.”* *“I hope her love of learning will continue.”* *“I want him to be pushed academically so he is prepared for the best opportunities in high school and beyond.”*


While our vision will continue to evolve over time, these are the ideas that will guide our decisions and shape our goal-setting for the future.



Students who are identified as being below grade level in reading will increase by at least one grade level within the school year.


