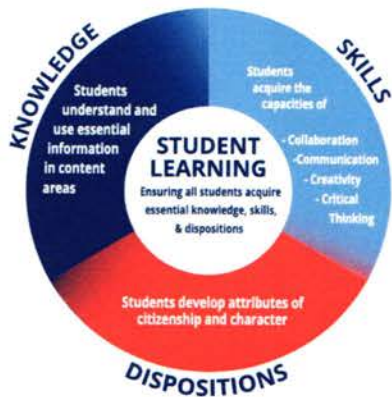

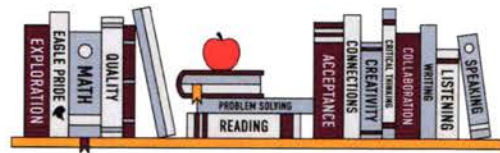
This bold vision will only be accomplished for EVERY

# GOOD NEWS AT OAK CANYON

- 35% of AP Human Geography students scored a 5 (Utah and global average is 12%)
- 95% of Oak Canyon 9<sup>th</sup> graders entered high school on track for graduation
- Dozens of monster dolls made by Oak Canyon FACS students donated to Geneva Elementary
- FBLA Chapter took 4<sup>th</sup> place in state
- More electronic books checked out than any other school in the district!
- Mike Redford, CTE teacher, named Utah State TSA Advisor of the Year
- Common class period created for all three OC Student Leadership Coalition groups
- Major upgrades to building: interior brick restored, new mural and quotes, outdoor benches, improved exterior lighting, blacktop and basketball hoops in rear courtyard, updated library tables, chairs, and shelving
- Added 400+ new Chromebooks and iPads to classrooms to enhance student learning

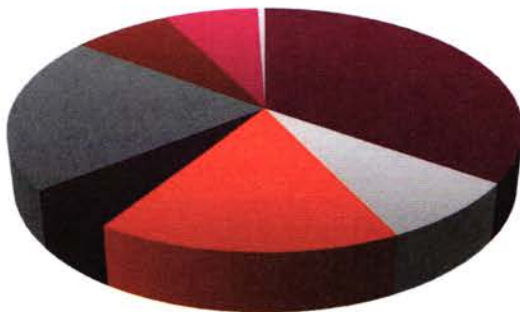
## What is the SCC?

## What are Trust Lands Funds used for this year?

Our focus for this year has been on safety and adapting to change. This is how we will spend the \$184,723 for 2020-2021



- Reading intervention, digital curriculum, math lab, etc. \$64,144
- Hope Squad, Student Success \$15,000
- Hourly Aides \$30,000
- Summer Collaboration \$10,000
- Benefits \$38,233
- Software and Technology (No Red Ink, Lexia, Imagine Math) \$13,500
- Leadership & Professional Development \$12,845
- Social/Emotional Wellness \$1,000
