

## ATTENDANCE REMINDERS

The last week of school brings with it an uptick in tardies and truancies. We are required to take attendance each day regardless. #### SAFE SCHOOLS REMINDER--PLEASE TALK ABOUT WITH YOUR STUDENTS

Student safety is a top priority at Oak Canyon. Recently, there have been some changes in both legislation and district policy in regard to safe schools. First, students are not allowed to have weapons or facsimiles of weapons on campus. This includes all manner of weapons you'd expect, but some you might not expect are pocket knives, multi-tools, paintball guns, and even water guns. If found with a weapon, real or fake, students will be subject to the same consequences. In addition, state legislation that went into effect on May 1st deems any threat to a school (bomb threat, school shooting, etc.) no matter if it is a real threat or fake is now considered a 3rd degree felony and will be subject to legal consequences. This is no laughing matter, and seek your partnership in sharing this information with all OCJH students. Thank you for your cooperation in this matter.

#### 9TH GRADE LAGOON DAY 5/22

Note: Upon arrival, find your Lagoon Chaperone. Chaperone lists are organized alphabetically by student last

names.

Lagoon Arrival Time: 9 AM

Departure from Lagoon for Trax Station: 3 PM

Arrive at Vineyard Trax Station: 4:59 PM

#### 9th Grade Lagoon Day Details:

All students attending the 9th grade Lagoon Day will need to ride Trax up with the school. There is no cost to ride Trax. Students will meet at 6:50 AM at the Vineyard Trax Station. Students will find out their Lagoon Chaperone upon arrival at the Trax Station. As mentioned above, Lagoon Chaperones are organized alphabetically by student last name. Once their chaperone is identified, students MUST check in with that chaperone. After all students have checked in, all Lagoon participants will load the Trax train and proceed to the Farmington Trax Station. (If you miss the Trax Train at Vineyard, you are not able to attend and no refunds will be issued.) Shuttle buses will be at the Farmington Station to take students to the entrance of Lagoon. Students will find their chaperone outside the Lagoon entrance to receive their entrance ticket. Students will need to bring money for lunch. It will not be provided by the school

At 3 PM, all students need to meet outside the park entrance and find their Lagoon Chaperone. Students will then board a shuttle bus and return to the Farmington Trax Station where they will load the Trax train to return to the Vineyard Station. Students will arrive by 5pm at the Vineyard Station. Transportation to the Vineyard Trax Station in the morning and home from the Trax Station in Vineyard after Lagoon is not provided by the school and must be arranged by the student.

## YEARBOOK DAY SCHEDULE 5/23

Students will start the day in their homeroom classes for 35 minutes due to yearbook distribution. After that, they will rotate through each of their 8 classes for 25 minutes each with 5 minute passing periods. There will be one common lunch after B8 and a yearbook signing party behind the school with food trucks until 2:15. Here is the rotation schedule:
